Subject: Fall, 2017 Enrollment Report

Enclosed is the Fall 2017 Enrollment Report. These data reflect university enrollments as of September 25, 2017. This year, total university enrollment is 50,019. There are no material changes from the Preliminary Enrollment Report which was prepared last month.

Big Ten University recruitment occurs across local, national and even international dimensions. It changes from one year to the next dependent upon demographics, student preparation and success, environment, costs, competition, the economy and public policy.

For the Fall of 2017 first time undergraduate Michigan enrollment strengthened with the proportion of students accepting admission (yield) increasing by almost one percentage point. Domestic out of state and international enrollment diminished slightly due to increasing competition and environmental change. In sum, total enrollment remains stable and reflects exemplary student preparation.

From an academic perspective, graduation rates are up one percentage point over the previous year and combined with an improving economy, MSU graduated 9,300 undergraduates, an increase of 370 over the previous year. Further, due largely to the positive economy master's level enrollment is down by 200 students over the previous year.

Together, the combined impact of more graduations in the previous year – leading to fewer returning students – and a decline in master's level students contributed to the predicted, small decline in total enrollment.

This year's Fall semester total university enrollment is 50,019 students and approximates planning for the 2017-18 period. Over the past five years enrollments ranged between 48,906 and 50,543.

Entering Class

- There were 36,143 applications received this year (well within the five year range of 30,340 to 37,480). Our first time undergraduate enrollment is 8,066 students (also within the five year range of 7,842 to 8,154).
- Average grade point is 3.7 and average ACT is 25.8. The average grade point continues a steady increase over recent years. Both grade point and average ACT score reflect a 3 to 4 percent increase over the past ten years.
- First time Honors College enrollment is 641 students comprising 7.9 percent of the entering class.
- This year's undergraduate entering class includes 1,751 students of color, or 24.6 percent of the domestic total (slightly above the five year range of 1,355 to 1,705).

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- New transfer enrollment is 1,669 students (within the five year range of 1,449 to 1,670).
- The combined entering class and transfer enrollment total, inclusive of summer admits, is 9,777 students, 75.3 percent of which are Michigan residents.

### Undergraduate and Graduate Students

- Total undergraduate enrollment is 38,996 students, down 94 from the previous year reflecting slightly larger first time enrollments offset by a diminished return rate due to increased graduations in the previous year and improvement in the economy. Total undergraduate enrollment reflects 75.8 percent Michigan residents.
- The proportion of female students to total undergraduate enrollment is 50.5 percent.
- There are 1,838 new graduate students at the master's and doctoral levels, an increase of 99 over the previous year.
- New graduate professional enrollment totals 585 students, down 24 medical students from the previous year.
- Total graduate enrollment, including graduate professional students, is 11,023 students, down 231 from last year. This change is attributable to fewer returning graduate students and largely reflects improvement in the economy.

### University

- Total university enrollment for students of color is 9,754 students, an increase of 315 or 22.6 percent of the domestic student body total.
- The enrollment mix between undergraduate, graduate and graduate professional students is 78.0 percent, 17.1 percent, and 4.9 percent, respectively.
- The Broad College of Business and the colleges of Social Science, Natural Science and Engineering will have the largest enrollments as of the official enrollment count date.
- The MSU College of Law total enrollment is currently 841 students of which 263 students are new.
